

Camper Cabin Information

Camper Cabin Rates (as of January 2015) \$135 /night +tax, 2 night minimum

In addition to camping rates, there is a \$5.00 park pass fee, per passenger vehicle, your first night, good through your whole stay unless you have an annual park pass.

- Camper Cabins sleep 5 (Cabin B sleeps 4), 2 adults and 2-3 children
- Central Heat and Air Conditioning & ceiling fans in the main living area and bedroom.
- Furnished outside is a picnic table, grill and fire ring.

Furnished in Camper Cabins A & C:

- One bedroom with queen size bed
- Sleeping loft with one full/double bed and one single bed (Narrow, 21 inch staircase to sleeping loft that is only 3.5 feet tall). Great for children or adults young at heart
- Mattresses provided, but no linens
- Kitchen with refrigerator, stove, oven, microwave, and coffee maker
- Full restroom with shower, but no bathtub, no towels provided
- Living area has high top kitchen table and 4 stools & couch and sitting chair
- Screened in porch with 2 rocking chairs

Furnished in ADA Accessible Camper Cabin B:

- One bedroom with queen size bed
- Sleeping loft with two single beds (Narrow, 21 inch staircase to sleeping loft that is only 3.5 feet tall). Great for children or adults young at heart
- Mattresses provided, but no linens
- Kitchen with refrigerator, stove, oven, microwave, and coffee maker
- Full restroom with shower, but no bathtub, no towels provided
- Living area has accessible table and 2 stools & two sitting chairs
- Screened in porch with 2 rocking chairs

Must bring your own bed linens, towels, pillows, dishes, pots & pans, and kitchen utensils.

No Smoking, no phone, NO PETS/DOGS.

To enjoy your camper cabin experience, we suggest you also bring the following:

- Dishes, cups, & silverware (Limited supply of pans, paper plates, plastic wear, and plastic cups available for purchase at Park Office gift shop)
- Food and grocery items (grocery store only 2 miles away)
- Outdoor chairs & cooking items (charcoal, lighter fluid, grilling utensils)

Reservations: Make reservations by calling 1-800-864-7275, (Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-8 p.m.; Saturday-Sunday, 9 a.m.-5 p.m. EST), or by going to our website at www.gastateparks.org.



Check-In/Check-Out: Check-in is between 4 pm and 8 pm and check-out is 11 am. A reservation confirmation must be presented at check-in. If you do not arrive on the first night of your stay, your reservation will be cancelled, and you will forfeit your deposit. Christmas Day check-in's are not allowed. Please defer camper cabin check in to the day before or the day after Christmas.

Park Gate: Park Entrance Gate is open from 7 am to 10 pm. The gate automatically locks at

10 pm. You can get out anytime and will be given the gate code at check in to be able to get in after 10 pm.

Motor Vehicles: Park roads are public roads. All vehicles are subject to license and safety requirements and regulations of the Georgia Department of Public Safety. ATVs are not allowed in State Parks. Washing vehicles including motor homes or RV's is not permitted.

Noise Levels: Please be considerate of guests who are visiting state parks for a quiet, natural experience. Radios, televisions, musical instruments, and all other noise making devices are not to be used between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. and must be kept at low volumes during other times.

Intoxicants: Consumption or use of alcoholic beverages or intoxicants is unlawful in any public use area. This means the only places alcohol is permitted on the park is inside your camper cabin or inside our rental facility the Group Shelter. Alcohol is not permitted in the Pioneer Campground or picnic areas.



Location: Skidaway Island State Park is located approximately 15 miles from downtown historic Savannah and 25 miles from our local beach (Tybee Island). No shuttle bus service is available from our park to local attractions; however, we provide excellent directions to areas of interest and to the Savannah historic district.

Public Programs: We offer excellent public programs that deal with the sites natural, cultural, historical and recreational resources. These programs are offered year round and are suited for all ages. Groups can also book a specific program for their group.

Please call 912-598-2301 for interpretive programming information. The park's Interpretive Center houses a giant ground sloth replica, natural and cultural exhibits, birding room, and reptile room. It is typically open Wednesdays - Sundays 10:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.



Hiking Trails: We have two nature trails and one connector trail, which offers approximately six miles of hiking trails. Our Sandpiper nature trail, a one-mile trail, is part of the Georgia Coastal Birding Trail.
