Internship Program

Expectations and Qualifications

- Junior or Senior year of BS degree
- Requires 40-hour work week
- Lasts a minimum of 168 days
- Meet standards of conduct as a representative of GSPHS
- Open, engaging, communicative candidates
- Enjoy the natural environment and customer service

MIT Program

The Manager-In-Training (MIT) Program is designed to teach individuals about the many and various aspects of PRHS site operations. Upon completion of the program, individuals would have a level of knowledge that would prepare them to compete for full time PRHS vacancies.

MIT Expectations and Qualifications

- BS in natural sciences, resource management, recreation, history, or business administration
- 29-hours per week
- Lasts for minimum of 6 months
- Meet standards of conduct as a representative of GSPHS
- Open, engaging, communicative candidates
- Enjoy the natural environment and customer service
- Usually the MIT is a paid position
- Eligible to competitively apply for open management positions upon completion of the MIT program
