Rules & Regulations

Fishing: Valid Georgia fishing license required. All state regulations apply. No live minnows may be used as bait.

Canoeing & Motor Boating: Motors limited to 10 hp or less. Each boat occupant must have a coast guard approved life preserver.

Swimming: Prohibited in refuge waters.

Pets: Pets are not permitted in public buildings or boats.

Disturbing or Collecting Plants or Animals: Strictly prohibited. Do not feed or harass the wildlife in any way.

Refuge Travel: Restricted to day-use waterways (without an overnight permit).

Wildlife Refuge Gate Hours: 7:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m.

Boat Motor Starting Procedure



1. Ensure kill switch is hooked up
2. Ensure gear selector is in the neutral (middle) position. Typically, straight up
3. Ensure fuel hose is connected to motor
4. Squeeze primer bulb until firm (2 or 3 squeezes)
5. Pull choke
6. Align throttle with start notch
7. Pull starter rope quickly
8. Once running, idle down by pushing in choke slowly and/or turning throttle down
9. Ensure motor is idling before changing gears
10. Move gear selector into desired direction of travel
